and arrived at the tomb first;


he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him,

BANANA-BERRY SMOOTHIE

1 banana, sliced 1/2 cup water

6 ounce yogurt 1/2 cup heavy cream

4 ounces frozen unsweetened strawberries, about 8

berries, don't thaw. 4 ice cubes

Put all but the strawberries and ice in blender; blend on high speed until smooth. Gradually add the berries and ice while blending on high speed. Makes about 3 1/2 cups or 2 large servings

HOME-MADE CHEESE SPREAD

8 ounces sharp cheddar cheese, shredded 1/2 cup mayonnaise 1 tbspn white vinegar 1 tablespoon Splenda Dash cayenne 1 tblspn grated onion 4 ounces roasted red peppers, In a medium bowl, whisk together the mayonnaise, vinegar, Splenda, cayenne and onion. Add the cheese and chopped/minced red peppers; mix well then chill a couple hours before serving. Makes almost 2 cups Use a hand shredder rather than a food processor to get the consistency right with the cheese.

Wisdom of Romero

Oscar Romero was the Archbishop of San Salvador in Central America. In 1980, his own government assassinated him because he defended the poor against those who attacked and killed them when they stood up for their rights.

People of our time, anguished about so many problems, deprived of hope, seeking paradise on this earth: Seek it not here, seek it in Christ arisen. Let us find in him relief for our afflictions, for our worries, for our anguish; and in him let us place our hopes.

Christ would not be Redeemer if he had not concerned himself with giving food to those who were hungry, if he had not given sight to the blind, if he had not felt sorrow for the forsaken crowds that had no one to love them, no one to help them. Christianity cares about human development, about the political and social aspects of life. Redemption would not be complete if it did not consider these aspects of the Christ who chose in fact to be an example of one oppressed under a powerful empire and under a ruling class of his people that savaged his reputation and honor and left him on a cross.

The church cannot be deaf or mute before the entreaty of millions of persons who cry out for liberation, persons oppressed by a thousand slaveries. But the church tells them what is the true liberty they must seek: the freedom that Christ began on earth when he rose and burst the chains of sin, of death, and of hell. It is to be like Christ, free of sin, to be truly free, with true liberation. Those who put their faith in the Risen One and work for a world more just, who protest against the injustices of the present system, against the abuses of unjust authorities, against the wrongfulness of humans exploiting humans; all those who begin their struggle with the resurrection of the great Liberator – they alone are authentic Christians.

JALAPEÑO POPPERS

8 fresh jalapeños

4 ounces cream cheese, softened

8 slices thin bacon, cut in half crosswise

Cut the chiles in half lengthwise; scrape out seeds and membranes*. Fill each half with cream cheese, but do not mound it. Four ounces should be just about the right amount for 8 average size jalapeño halves. If you have extra large chiles, make sure you have a full 8 ounces of cream cheese on hand. Wrap each with 1/2 slice raw bacon, making sure to start with the end on the bottom of the chile. Stretch the bacon slightly to make it go all the way around each chile once (see photo below), then tuck ends underneath. Place cream cheese side up on foil-lined baking sheet. These can be assembled and chilled until just before baking and serving. Bake at 375° 20-25 minutes. If bacon isn't quite done, broil a few more minutes to brown. Makes 16 servings

TASTY TUNA DEVILED EGGS

6 ounce can tuna, drained

1/2 cup mayonnaise

6 hard boiled eggs, peeled and sliced in half

2 tbsp onion, minced 2 tbsp celery, minced

1/2 teaspoon mustard Salt

1/8 teaspoon pepper Pinch celery salt Remove the yolks from the whites and mash them. Mix in the remaining ingredients until smooth; fill the egg whites with the yolk mixture. Dust with paprika. Makes 6-12 servings

CHRIS'S UGLY GREEN BEAN SNACK

tablespoons oil, about Salt, to taste
Do not thaw green beans. Line a large baking sheet
with heavy foil. Cut open the bag of green beans and
pour in the oil. Close the bag and shake to coat the
beans completely. Pour out onto the prepared baking
sheet. Bake at 275° for about 1 1/2 to 2 hours or until
the beans are very dark and crisp, but not burnt.
Remove from the oven and immediately sprinkle with
salt and other seasonings. Makes about 2 cups or four
1/2-cup servings
