Easy Very Tasty Home-made Pudding

1/2 cup sugar | 2 eggs | 1 tsp vanilla (optional) | 3 tbsp flour | 2 cups milk | 2 tbsp butter (optional)

Mix flour and sugar together, add milk and beaten eggs, mix very well, so there are no lumps. Add butter and cook over medium heat until thickened, stirring constantly. Banana pudding: Add sliced bananas and vanilla extract. Pineapple pudding: Add some crushed pineapple. Chocolate: Add 1/4 cup cocoa to the dry ingredients before adding milk.

Easy Very Tasty Brownie Mix

Mix 6 cups flour, 6 cups sugar, 2 cups cocoa. Mix well, store in airtight container.

Easy Very Tasty Brownies from Mix

2 cups Easy Very Tasty brownie mix 2 eggs, 1 stick of butter (melted) Add melted butter to the brownie mix, then add the beaten eggs. Mix well. Bake at 350 degrees in 9 inch square pan for about 15 minutes. Icing: Mix 1/3 cup milk, 1 stick oleo and 4 tbsp of cocoa, bring to a boil. Remove from heat and add 2 cups powdered sugar and 1 tsp vanilla. Spread on brownies.

She said, "Bobby Max, the reason you can't make a good pie crust is because you haven't made enough pies. When you have made 100 pies, I bet your pie crust is as good as mine."
